English Expressions about Sheep

Sheep were one of the first animals that people farmed, and they have been a part of our lives for more than 10,000 years. That's why there are many English expressions about sheep.

When a person is called the "black sheep of the family," it means they often cause problems or do not fit in with the family. This expression may have come from the fact that farmers often don't want black sheep as much as white sheep because black wool can't be colored. If a friend told you __18__ your older brother had invited them to play cards, you might say, "Don't go! He's the black sheep of the family! He'll cheat and take away all your money!"

If someone calls you a "sheep," they are usually saying that you follow others and don't think for yourself. A group of people __19__ act this way might even be called "sheeple." This word combines "sheep" with "people," and was added to the dictionary in 2017. Your friend could say, "I don't think your brother is bad just because your family thinks so! __20__ — I'll think for myself and go only if I want to!"

Someone or something that is __21__ and doesn't know that it's in danger can be said to be "like a lamb to the slaughter" — a young sheep being taken to be killed and eaten. The US Teenagers Prefer Texting Over Talking

American teenagers would rather text their friends than speak to them in person, a new study from Common Sense Media says. The study found that 35 % of young people between the ages of 13 and 17 would rather chat with their friends through sending messages on their smartphones. Teenagers also say that even when they do meet their friends in person, social media often distracts them from the people they're with. They just can't help checking their Facebook or Line.

More than half of the teenagers also agree that social media doesn't help with their personal relationships and their study, while almost one-third say it even disrupts their sleep. Worryingly, more than half of the teenagers said that their parents would be a lot more worried about social media if they knew what their kids did on it. For example, teens may take some pictures which is not good and send to others.

Social media makes our lives more convenient. They help us keep in touch with others more easily. However, over course of using social media, we lost some chances to talk to each other face to face. The parents should arrange more activities for teens and help them to use the social media wisely.

There are more and more cyber-attacks and theft online. They make the Internet seem like a scary place these days. Last week, a billion dollars were stolen from the banks all over the world. Millions of computer systems get viruses. How can people protect or make it more difficult for hackers to get their information? There are four tips you should know.

1. Make your passwords harder to hack

Hard passwords include upper and lower case letters, numbers and special characters. They should be at least eight characters in length. They should also not be the words for hackers to find out easily, like your pet's name or the name of a family member.

2. Change your passwords more often

A very common mistake made by users is to create one hard password, but then never change it. Remember! No password is unbreakable. Hackers can hack many accounts which have the same password.

3. Clear your browser history

You have to clear your browser history in your home computer, your work computer, your cellphone or your friend's iPad. Internet browsers, like Firefox or Chrome, keep the way of where you've been and what you've done online. It is very easy for anyone who sees that information to steal a record of your online activities.

4. Don't log in the websites you don't know

The hackers will use the fake websites to get your personal information. If you link it, you may lose your account. Don't enter the website you don't know and don't give your personal information to anyone.

A Street Cat Named Bob

Bob, a pet cat which inspired a movie and several books, has died at around 14 years old. Musician James Bowen, who was fought with drug addiction at that time, found the cat abandoned and decided to adopt him in 2007. They helped each other. Bob helped Bowen quit his drug addiction and Bowen tried to work harder for both of them.

Bowen soon started taking Bob with him when he performed on the streets of London and sold *The Big Issue*, a magazine sold by homeless or poor people to help them make money in many countries. Bowen could earn more money with Bob because people were attracted by them. Later, a local newspaper told their story, and they became famous. In 2012, Bowen wrote a book about Bob, *A Street Cat Named Bob*, and soon became a British bestseller. The book was followed by *The World According to Bob*, *A Gift from Bob*, and *The Little Book of Bob*. Together, the four books were sold more than 8 million copies in 40 languages. *A Street Cat Named Bob* was even turned into a movie of the same name.

On Bowen’s Facebook, Bowen said that Bob saved his life. “He gave me so much more than companionship. I found a direction and purpose that I’d been missing.” he said. "He's met thousands of people, touched millions of lives. There's never been a cat like him. And never will again.”
